Problem Statement <i>(An intersection between food security and climate change)</i>	<p>Climate change and global warming have become a great concern all over the world. Climate change can be a natural process where temperature, rainfall, wind, and other elements vary over decades or more. But over the years, we are experiencing unprecedented rapid warming as a result of human activities, primarily due to burning fossil fuels that generate greenhouse gas emissions. Increasing greenhouse gas emissions from human activity act like a blanket wrapped around the earth, trapping the sun’s heat, and raising temperatures.</p> <p>Although South Africa is food secure at the national level, the country is still food insecure at the household level as not all households have access to adequate food. Almost 20% of South African households had inadequate or severely inadequate access to food in 2017. This varied by province, population group of household heads, and household size.</p> <p>It is therefore critical to engage in activities that have the potential to curb the effects of climate change and contribute to addressing the issues around food insecurity.</p>
Green Development Foundations’ Response	<p>In response to COP27’s call to come together to take action toward achieving the world’s collective climate goals. The Green Development Foundation believes that planting trees globally will contribute to curbing the effects of climate change and will also address the issues related to food insecurity.</p> <p>Our focus as the Green Development Foundation will be based on promoting home/community-based gardens, Planting fruit and indigenous trees to curb the effects of climate change and addressing issues around food insecurity and raising awareness of intersections between food security and climate change.</p> <p>As a result of a global crisis that the world is facing, South Africa through His Excellence, President Cyril Ramaphosa has committed a national target of planting 10 million trees. President Cyril Ramaphosa, acting in his capacity as chairperson of the Committee of African Head of States and Governments on Climate Change, committed South Africa to prioritize mitigation, adaptation, and climate support to mitigate and adapt our country to climate effects.</p>
