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

Background

In 2013 the Unisa Department of Environmental Sciences and Johannesburg City Parks and Zoo formulated an MoU and became involved in efforts to conserve and improve Mofolo Park in Soweto.





Mofolo Park hosts a number of events including music concerts, cycling and running events. The **Remembrance Garden project** involves tree planting in memory of local heroes. The park has been partially rehabilitated, but in need of additional investment.

In 2015, the environmental education and awareness project was formulated.

The team composed of Unisa staff and members from the JCPZ Environmental Education division.

The aim of the project is to enhance environmental learning through informed environmental responses To initiate the Environmental Education (EE) project, contextual profiling was done using structured questionnairs, participative observations and face to face interviews were carried out at three primary and three secondary schools bordering Mofolo Park

During the initial site visits, participative observations were done around the school grounds considering littering, the aesthetic appeal of the school, existing vegetation, water availability and enthusiasm of school management to participate in EE activities.

After careful consideration Emisebeni Junior Primary School was selected to implement the EE project




