

#### **GREENING I**

# Greening is a national function of the Dept of Forestry, Fisheries and the Environment (DFFE)

- It is a form of Community Forestry as defined in the NFA Chapter 4
- It is spearheaded by DFFE in partnership with various stakeholders
- It rolls out at local level & therefore it has to be in local plans (IDP's)
  & other related plans
- It supports Outcome 10 of the MTSF





#### **GREENING II**

Greening is the planting, care and management of all vegetation types in urban and rural areas, to secure multiple benefits for residents" (National greening Strategy, 2010)

Targeted areas include:

Cities, townships and informal settlements or new development areas.

 Greening follows an integrated approach, mainly focusing on parks, streets, open spaces, green belts, cemeteries, as well as homesteads.





## NATIONAL ARBOR CITY AWARDS (NACA)

- It is a greening competition for municipalities started in 2002.
- It is administered by DFFE and sponsored by TOTAL Energies
- Other main partners are the IERM and SANBI
- It has four categories: Metropolitan; Local; Small Rural Local Municipality and Youth Participation in Greening.





#### **OBJECTIVES OF ARBOR CITY AWARDS**

- To promote the Ten Million Trees Programme
- To promote the development of provincial and local greening plans.
- To extend greening in local municipalities to disadvantaged areas
- To ensure compliance with relevant environmental legislations
- To raise awareness on the importance and value of trees in residential settlements
- To promote greening of the country in general
- To provide a platform for diagnosis of challenges facing municipalities regarding greening funding and also to discuss solutions.





#### **ADVERTISEMENT OF THE NACA**

NACA is advertised in April every year using the following platforms:

- DFFE website
- IERM website
- Coordinated and communicated through IERM internal networks
- DFFE also contacts and communicates directly with municipalities.





### REQUIREMENTS OF NACA COMPETITION

- Entry form and POE
- Category A and B municipalities (Metro and Local)

**POE:** Concept on Ten Million Trees Programme; Greening policy or strategy, tree registers, maintenance plans and budget

- motivation
- project videos or pictures
- Small Rural Local Municipalities (Category C)

**POE:** Concept on Ten Million Trees Programme; potential for greening; a written account of environmental/ greening projects

- a motivation
- project videos or pictures
- Youth Participation in Greening Category: Demonstration of youth involvement in greening projects through PoE or during project visits





#### **ADJUDICATION PROCESS OF NACA**



June – July 2022



First shortlist is a desk exercise (evaluation of entry forms and POE)



Visit to shortlisted Municipalities



Winners announced in August 2022

#### **LESSONS LEARNT**

- Municipalities often fail to meet the deadline (closing date for entries and delivery of POE)
- Some municipalities assign the filling up of the entry forms to inappropriate people and wrong information is provided
- Incomplete, inaccurate POE's are handed in
- Presentations are done by junior people who at times cannot articulate issues sufficiently
- Time allocated to presentations and field trips is not well managed
- Generally most municipalities do not have an approved policy or strategy
- Tree administration tools such as a register are usually lacking
- Some municipalities enter the competition once and then give up





#### BENEFITS OF THE NACA COMPETITION

- Municipalities that frequently enter the competition gather experience and tend to excel
- Entering the NACA has a marketing value both locally and internationally
- It raises the level of awareness and interest of senior management and councillors
- It has monetary value which assists municipalities in their greening initiatives





#### CONCLUSION

- We need the relevant people to handle the Arbor City Awards competition within municipalities
- Presenters must be on top of their presentations
- We need inputs from the IERM members on how to continuously improve the competition
