

- Protection of the Public
- Protection of the Environment
- To register Professionals and Candidates
- To liaise with the CBE

## PROTECTION OF THE PUBLIC AND THE ENVIRONMENT WITH REGARDS TO HEALTH AND SAFETY


- 1. Generate and Set Standards
- 2. Consult with the Council on Higher Education
- 3. Consult with the South African Qualifications Authority
- 4. Conduct accreditations in Institutions of Higher Education
- 5. Conduct examinations
- 6. Register candidates and professionals
- 7. Determine conditions for Continuing Professional Development (CPD)
- 8. Recognise Voluntary Associations
- 9. Identification of Landscape Architectural and Landscape Management Work
- 10. Administer a Code of Conduct
- 11. Investigate improper conduct
- 12. Determine and publish guideline professional fees
- 13. Discipline registered persons

## SACLAP COUNCIL

Council is appointed by Minister of Public Works & Infrastructure

- 4-year term
- 10 members:
  - 6 from the professional fraternity,
  - 2 from Government
  - 2 Public representatives

# WHY ARE SOME PROFESSIONS AND OCCUPATIONS REGULATED?

 Section 22 of the Constitution of the Republic of South Africa: Freedom of trade, occupation and profession

"Every citizen has the right to choose .......freely. The practice of a trade, occupation or profession may be regulated by law."

- A regulatory body is a public entity that is empowered by law to exercising autonomous authority over an area of human activity in an authoritative or supervisory capacity.
- A regulatory body is a creature of law.
- SACLAP is a regulatory body




## SACLAP ROUTES OF REGISTRATION

- Registration by review for Foreign Qualifications
- 3. Recognition of Prior Learning
- 4. Special Dispensation extensive experience

## SPECIAL DISPENSATION



#### MAINTENANCE OF PROFESSIONAL REGISTRATION

- Code of Professional Conduct
- Registration valid for 5 years
- Annual fees invoiced on 1 April
- Invoice to be paid within 60 days
- Continuing Professional Development (CPD)
- Renewal of Registration after 5 years good standing
- Assist a committee member/mentor/assessor...etc

#### **ANNUAL FEES**

Section 20(1)(a)(iii) of the Landscape Architectural Profession Act provides that annual fees must be paid with 60 days of them being due

#### Annual Fees consist of:

- Annual Registration Fee
- Annual Education Fund
- Annual CBE Levies
- CPD Annual Submission Fee
